


Fig. 6. Athens, Olympicion in the phase of Marcus Cossutius, according to Wycherley.


380 Plan of the Olympieion and surroundings.

- ABANDONED .....
- NEW TEMPLE STARTED IN 175 B.C.
- THE FIRST CORINTHIAN TEMPLE!
- WAS RESUMED UNDER HADRIAN IN AN ENCLOSURE THAT INCLUDED 110 STATUES





TRANSPORTED TO ROME
























IONIC ORDER AT BASSAE



CORINTHIAN ORDER AT BASSAE





Fig. 56.—Temple of Apollo Epicurius at Bassae.


