The **collection** of the Library of the School of Philosophy (LSPh) covers a wide range of fields of study in humanities in various forms and categories. Greek language, literature, philosophy, Greek history and art are its main holdings. Latin literature, European languages and literature (English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, Russian), pedagogy, psychology as well as music and theater make up the mosaic of an extensive collection of nearly 500,000 items, mainly books and journals.

The Special Collections include the rare printed materials of the Library. There is also rich audiovisual material (cd, dvd, vinyl records, etc.), various databases and the Pergamos institutional repository with digital collections.

Ask: I consult the staff of the Library to help me find the material I need, get support about my research, borrow books, use digital tools and services, publish my work in the repository..

**Search:** I find material for my courses and assignments through the Library's electronic catalogs, bibliographic databases, electronic journals, the website of the Library and Information Center (LIC) of NKUA and the Pergamos repository.





**Borrow:** If I am a member of the School of Philosophy, I can register to use the Library, borrow material and be able to request an interlibrary loan from the libraries of NKUA and other academic institutions in the country.

Order: I can order copies of journal articles and book chapters from other academic libraries in Greece and abroad.

Study: I can use a variety of study spaces, individual study rooms and the Music Study Room.
