


EUROPEAN UNION Towards EU Membership

Copenhagen Criteria

(a) that the candidate country has achieved stability of institutions guaranteeing democracy, the rule of law, human rights and respect for and protection of minorities

(b) the existence of a functioning market economy as well as the capacity to cope with competitive pressure and market forces within the Union



(c) Membership presupposes the candidate's ability to take on the obligations of membership including adherence to the aims of political, economic and monetary union.



October 2024: Opened Negotiations



December 2021: 22 out of 35 Chapters opened, provisionally closed 2



December 2024: 33 out of 35 Chapters opened, provisionally closed 6



December 2023: Screening Process
Completed



December 2023: European Council decided to open accession negotiations with Bosnia



January 2024: Not a candidate status, benefits from visa-free travel

The EU actively promotes democratic governance, the rule of law, and anti-corruption measures. By supporting independent institutions, civil society organizations, and judicial reforms, the EU strengthens democratic resilience in the region.

Economic and Financial Assistance

The EU is the largest trade partner and investor in the Western Balkans. Through financial instruments like the Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance (IPA), the EU provides funding for infrastructure, education, governance reforms, and environmental projects.



Geopolitical Importance

- The Western Balkans are at the crossroads of East and West, making them a strategic focal point in great-power competition.
- Western Balkans are not a foreign policy priority for the Kremlin.
- Russia ensures it maintains a certain degree of influence in the region to counterbalance Euro-Atlantic integration.



Historical - Cultural - Religious Ties

Historical Ties: In the 19th century, Russia supported Slavic revolts against the Ottoman Empire. Russia has historically supported Serbia, particularly during the Balkan Wars (1912–1913) and World War I, when it positioned itself as a protector of Slavic nations against the Austro-Hungarian and Ottoman Empires.

Cultural Ties: The Russian language and literature have influenced Serbian and other Slavic cultures, with many classic Russian literary works being widely read and

appreciated in the region.

Historical - Cultural - Religious Ties



The shared Eastern Orthodox Christian faith is a key link, with the Serbian Orthodox Church maintaining strong ties to the Russian Orthodox Church.



Russia has also provided financial and political support for Orthodox religious sites, such as its contributions to the completion of Belgrade's Saint Sava Temple, one of the largest Orthodox churches in the world.



Kostantin Malofeev, a billionaire close ally of Putin runs the Charitable Foundation of St. B<mark>asil</mark> the Great, largest Russian Orthodox charity foundation in the Balkans, promoting a pan-Slavic narrative. This religious framing provides legitimation for anti-Western domestic and foreign policies, especially in Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Montenegro.

Asymmetric Operations

Media Outlets

- Journalists are directly funded by Moscow.
- Anti-Western narratives, foster regional instability, and portray any change to the status quo as hostile.

 Content reaches Bosnian, Croatian, and Montenegrin audiences.



Radicalization

- Accused of organizing youth camps and research initiatives that serve as radicalization hubs.
- Ejup Maqedonci: "these activities encourage criminal operations in northern Kosovo, further destabilizing the region and boosting security risks"


Investments and Debt Traps



Montenegro's Bar-Boljare highway project -> China Road and Bridge Corporation (CRBC) China Eximbank could claim Montenegrin territory.

Montenegro's debt to China constitutes 22% of its GDP

North Macedoniagovernment borrowed over \$800 million from China Eximbank for two highways: Miladinovci-Shtip (completed in 2020) and Kichevo-Ohrid






- University exchanges, sinology programs, and cultural centers in Tirana and Belgrade
- In Montenegro, China's embassy has funded educational institutions, encouraging a collaboration between the University of Donja Gorica (UDG) and Chinese universities and business entities




Western Balkans' public opinion on China (2022)

- Nurturing a network of pro-Western intellectuals and professionals
- The Fulbright Program provides opportunities for students, scholars, and professionals from the Western Balkans to study, teach, or conduct research in the U.S., and vice versa.
- Many Fulbright scholars in the Western Balkans focus on fields like law, political science, journalism, and human rights, reinforcing democratic governance and civil liberties.
- In a region where EU, Russian, and Chinese influences compete, the Fulbright Program serves as a counterbalance to authoritarian soft power efforts.
