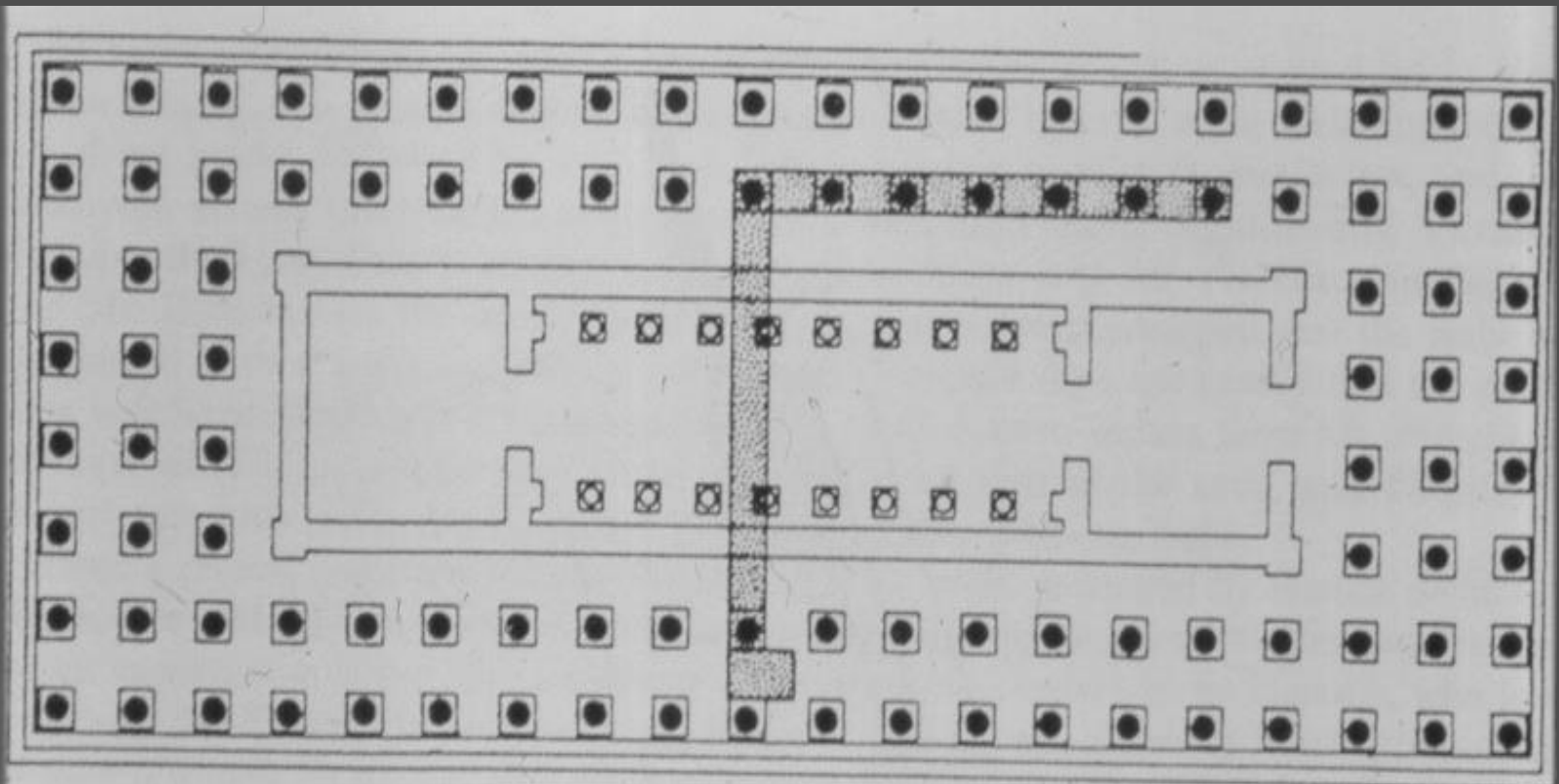
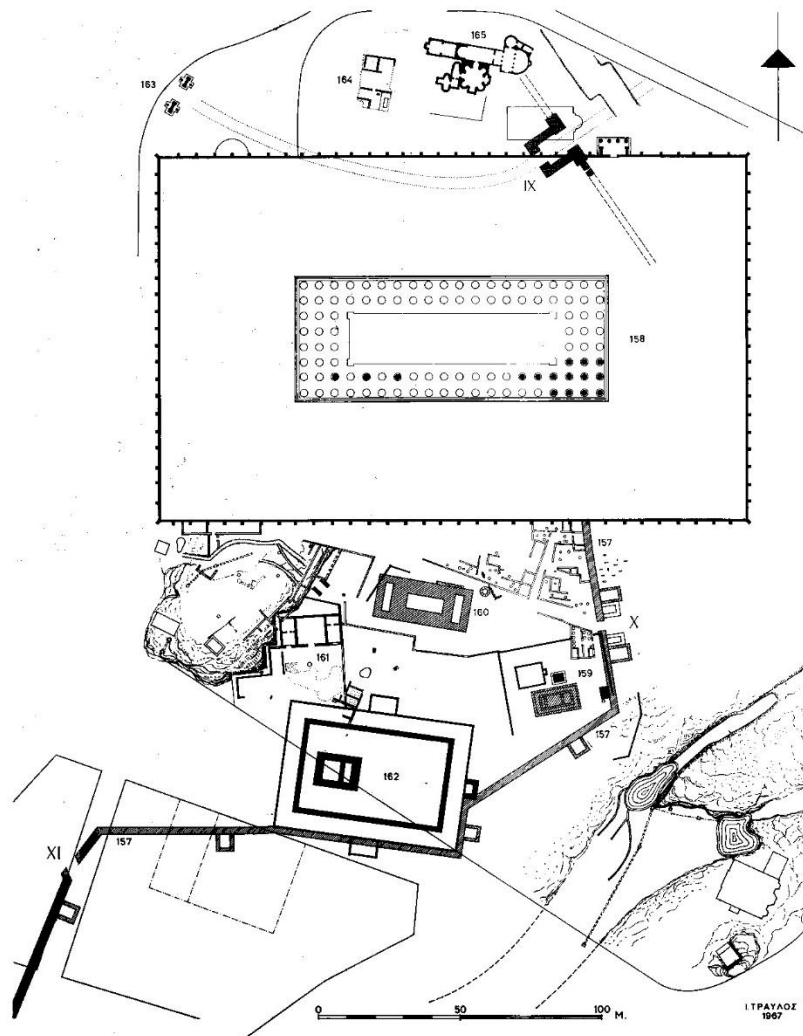


FIG. 6. Athens, Olympieion in the phase of Marcus Cossutius, according to Wycherley.

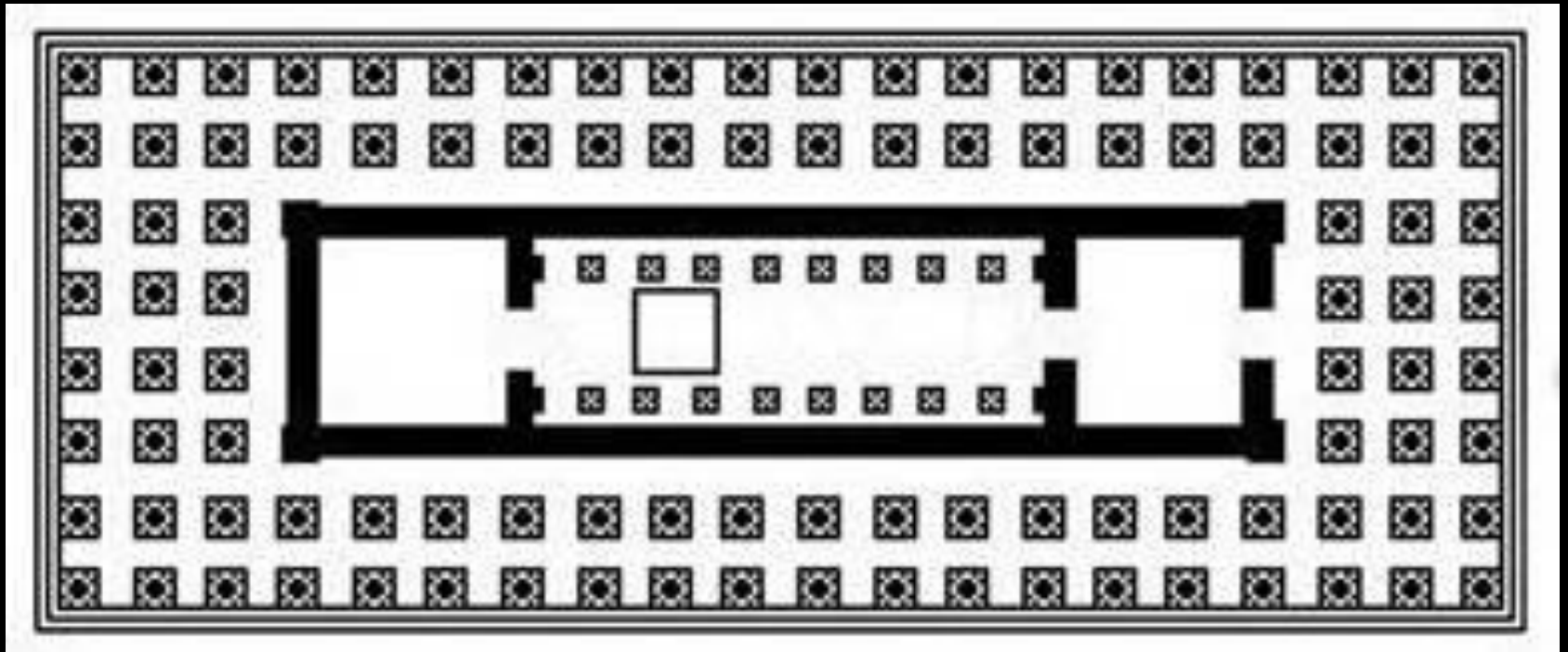


380 Plan of the Olympieion and surroundings.

- ABANDONED .....
- NEW TEMPLE STARTED IN 175 B.C.
- **THE FIRST CORINTHIAN TEMPLE!**
- WAS RESUMED UNDER HADRIAN IN AN ENCLOSURE THAT INCLUDED 110 STATUES
- TYRANT – RULER - EMPEROR

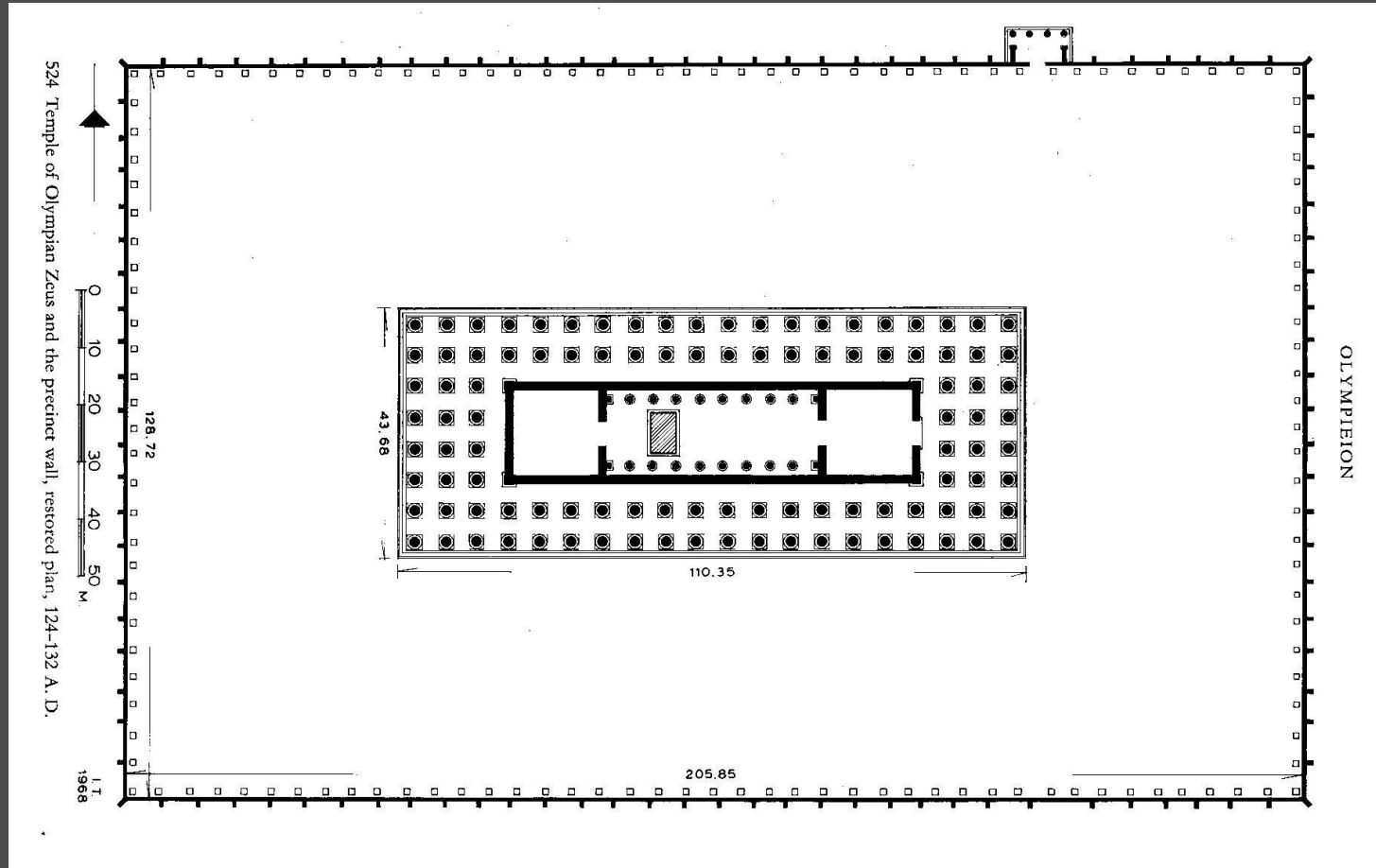

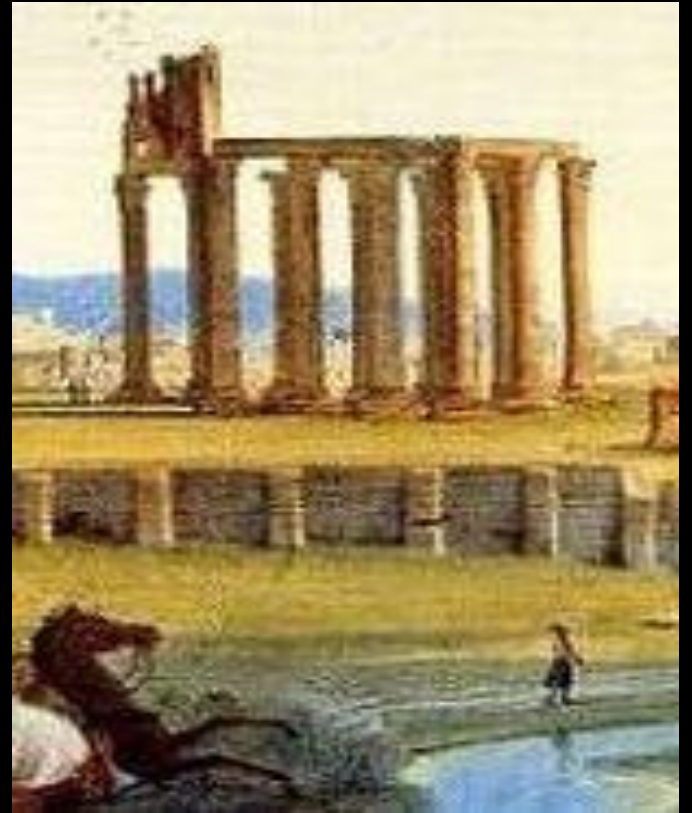

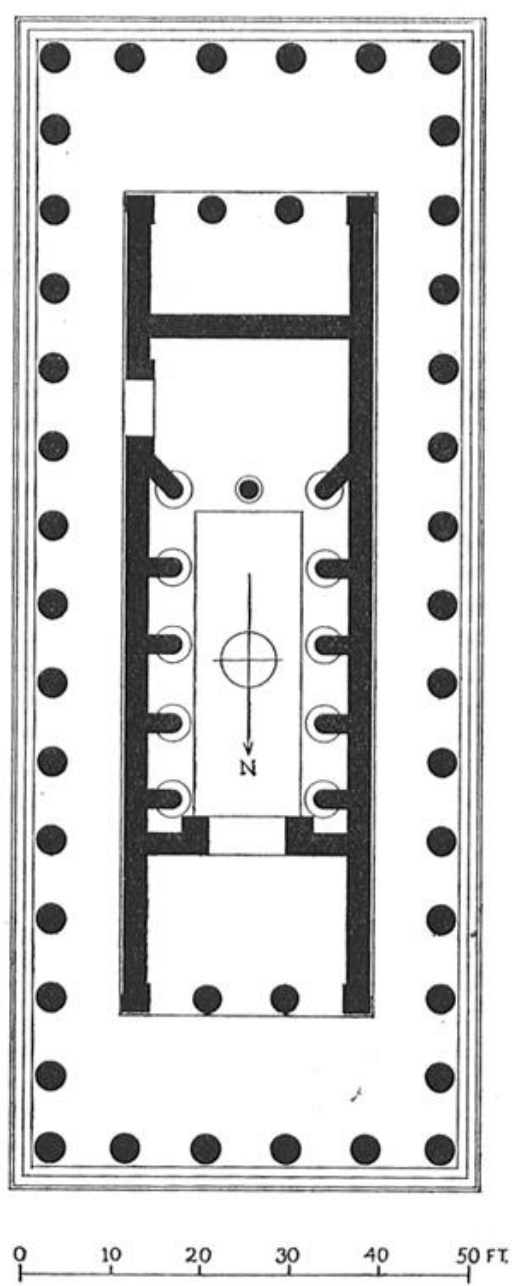
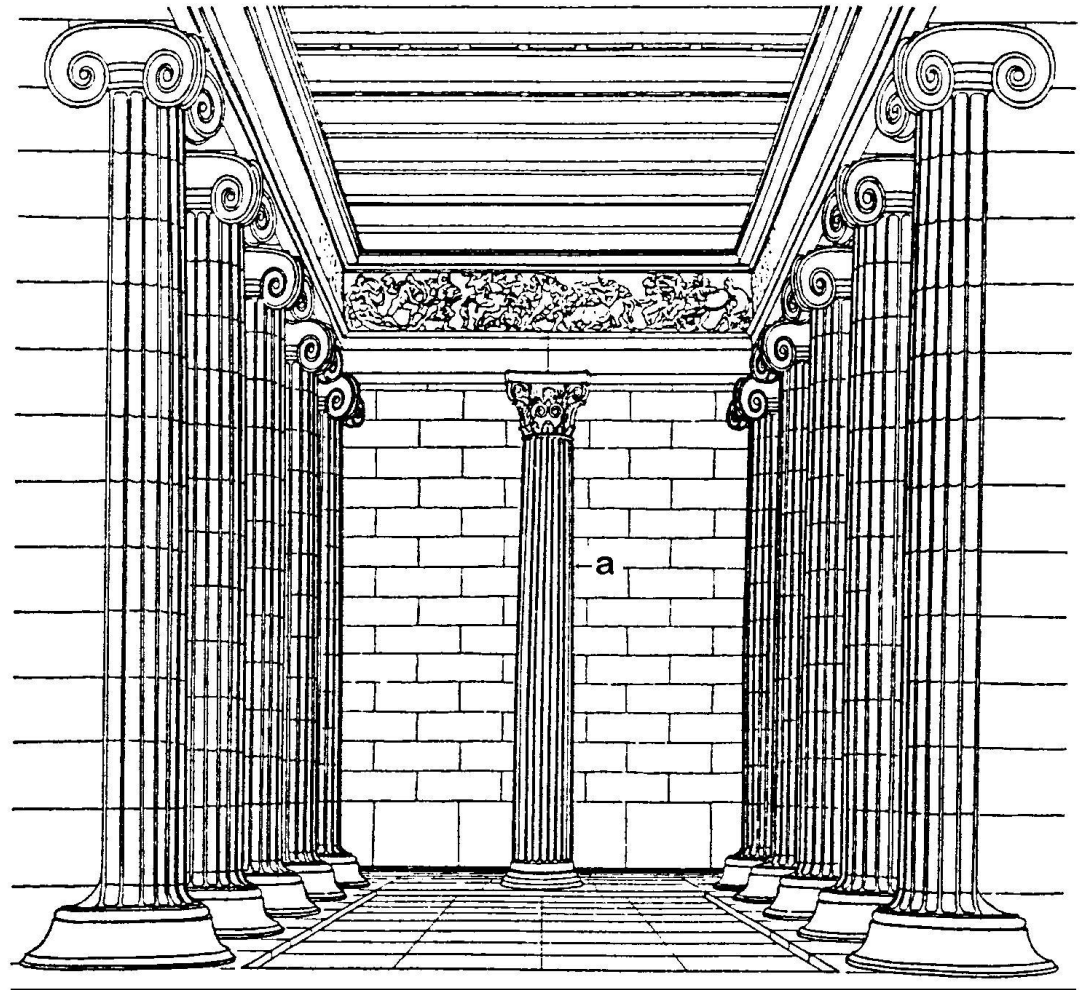
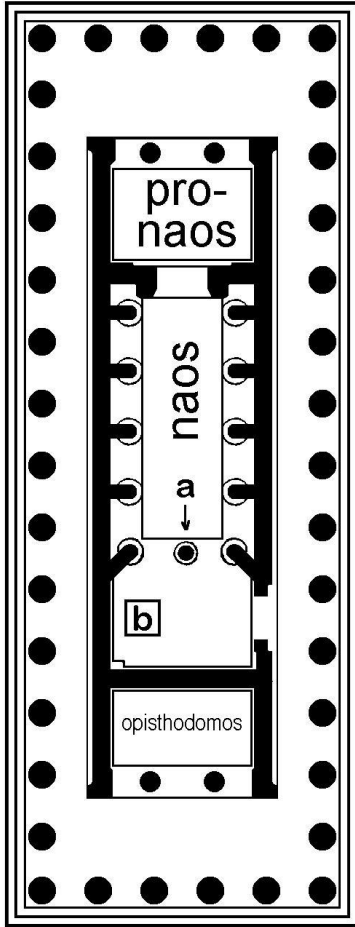


FIG. 56.—TEMPLE OF APOLLO EPICURIUS AT BASSAE.
