## **COURSE RULES**

Registration on the course means the student has accepted and agrees to respect the rules of the game, as laid out below.

The course is addressed to students who:

- Want to undertake an individual research project (term paper)
- Will participate systematically in the course and attend all classes

If these conditions do not apply, it is not recommended to enrol in this course.

### Student Obligations / Grading

- A <u>written term paper (essay)</u> of 12-15 pages. The essay is a case study of the European policy of a selected EU member-state. The country is chosen in collaboration with the professor.
- A <u>short in-class oral presentation</u> of your chosen country.
- Active participation in the class throughout the semester.
- A final <u>oral examination</u> on your term paper and the European policy of your chosen country.

All the above 4 elements will be taken into account in the final grade.

#### Language

- The language of instruction in this course is English.
- All student oral presentations will be made in English.
- Term papers may be submitted in either English or Greek.
- Students may be examined in either English or Greek. Usually a student who submits a term paper in one language will be examined in that language, but this may be discussed with the instructor.

### **Enrolment in the Course**

Apart from the official enrolment in the course (Departmental Secretariat or Erasmus office), the student should also declare her/his participation to the professor.

- Your chosen country with 2 alternative choices.
